State and Local Requirements

Only Rain Down the Drain

It's illegal to let anything other than rainwater go down a storm drain.

Keep compliant! Follow best management practices to prevent heavy metals, oils, grease products, toxic chemicals, debris, and paint from going into storm drains.

When it rains, stormwater picks up everything in the street, gutter, parking lot, or storm drain and sends it untreated to the local creeks, Delta, and the Bay. Learn how to handle and dispose of pollutants properly.

It is the responsibility of the business owner to train staff on proper spill and clean-up procedures and stormwater BMPs. Failure to comply with this request may result in the issuance of an administrative citation or fines that accrue daily. Learn more about this at www.cccleanwater.org.
