Now is the chance to put them to use! This month we're sharing techniques that you can add to your 2022 sustainable new year's resolution list. Let's dive in!

Recycling

Recycling is a small step you can take to make a positive impact on the environment. Practicing this habit at home does not require much effort if you spend some time creating a well-planned recycling system. This can look like placing a recycle-only bin in your kitchen, flattening out cardboard boxes for pick up days, and finding out what items are recyclable. Common recyclable household items include:

- Plastic bottles, dressing and condiment containers
- Glass jars and bottles
- Paper newspapers, envelopes, cards
- Cans all empty soda, fruit, vegetable, and other food cans.



An additional step you can take to help our local recycling centers is to rinse off all items before placing them in the bin. This helps keep foul odors to a minimum and make the reuse process easier.

Sustainable Swaps

Another resolution that you can make in 2022 is to examine your daily routine and see where you are able to make more sustainable choices. - Plastic shopping bags > Reusable fabric or recycled totes
- Plastic straws > Reusable straws or no straw
- Disposable batteries > Rechargeable options
- Paper towels > Cloth rags
